- DRUG ENFORCEMENT \$16,290
 - Over the last three years the City of Lauderhill has registered over 1000 drug incidents and over 900 aggravated assaults with weapons. Historical data indicates that in many cases the assaults are directly related to the drug activities. Funding from the 2010 JAG will be dedicated to assist the Lauderhill Police Department in attacking street level drug activities.

 - SWAT/COMMAND POST EQUIP \$16,000
 - CSU – PORTABLE BIOMETRIC DEV. \$ 10,000
 - The key focus area that will be addressed with the 2010 JAG funding will be technology improvements. With funds from this grant the department will purchase equipment that can be utilized on the street to capture fingerprints that can be used with and linked to the AFIS system. This should greatly improve our ability to identify suspects who have committed crimes in our city. The funding will also allow the department to purchase state of the art SmartBoards for use in SWAT situations and for critical incidents where Incident Command has been activated. These boards will greatly enhance our ability to present information in an interactive forum.

 - DIVERSIONARY PROGRAMS \$20,000
 - This initiative will address the needs of at-risk children during the summer season when many fall victim to criminal acts. Funding from 2010 JAG will be used to help fund a summer program for these children aimed at diverting their interests from activities that could result in arrest and focusing them on positive actions. The program will partner with community groups and other city departments to provide activities for children so that they will remain involved throughout the summer
